





Bridge of the Moon, Idaho



Increasing the understanding, appreciation, and preservation of nature's most fascinating and beautiful landforms.




Formed in 1988, The Natural Arch and Bridge Society is a national non-profit organization that supports the interests of amatuer arch enthusiasts and serious researchers alike.
